CEMETERY RULES

You have purchased the right of burial in a specific lot in a Wales Cemetery.

The following conditions apply:

- You must be a resident or a former resident of the Town of Wales to own this right.
- You may bury whomever you like. However non family persons must have prior permission from the Cemetery Authorities.
- When the owner of the lot dies, the right of burial in that lot passes to his or her legitimate heirs.
- No burials will be permitted in lots not clear of all debts.
- All work of every description performed on the lot by the purchaser must have prior approval by the Cemetery Authorities
- No monuments may be erected without the approval of the Cemetery Authorities.
- Flat markers of stone or bronze will not have a foundation. Bronze plaques will have a cement backing accomplished by the Commission to add weight to the Plaque.
 Cost of installing these markers will be determined at the time of installation
- Presently the cost is \$50.00 for granite and \$75.00 for a bronze plaque.
- Upright stones must have cement and stone foundation. Cost to be determined by size of monument.
- No shrubs or flowers may be planted on lots.
- No trinkets may be loosely placed on a grave. They may be firmly attached to a monument.
- Miniature evergreens may be placed in line with the monument. If these grow large enough to block the view of the monuments may have to be removed.
- Whenever a burial takes place in the lot a burial fee is charged to cover the cost
 of digging and burial.

Presently these fees are as follows:

Full burial: \$350.00

Cremation: \$50.00

Cemetery visiting hours are dawn to dusk.

Entrance to cemeteries for other than visiting purposes is strictly forbidden.
