New Business

Designation as a Purple Heart Community: Wilfred Jarvais, VFW Post 2596 Commander

Motion 042919-01 by Selectman Whalen; Seconded by Selectmen Matchett

Brian Wohlet explains that the Purple Heart city and town program is a nationwide project. Becoming a purple heart community is a profound way of thanking our veterans and becomes an educational resource for the younger generation who see the purple heart signs around the community which serves as a reminder of those who have fought and been injured defending our country. Mr. Wohlet then reads the Town of Wales Purple heart proclamation.

The Chief and the board discuss the significant expense with a private service.)

Old Business

Old Sturbridge Academy Charter School Better World Day

Motion 042919-14 by Selectman Whalen; Seconded by Selectman Matchett

Selectman Whalen explains that the Old Sturbridge Academy Charter School for Better World Day is conducting a student led project where they would like to plant a tree in Wales. Selectman Whalen and Boyce discuss the possible location for the planting of this tree since specific locations may need further approval by different departments. The board decides to authorize the students at Old Sturbridge Academy to plant a tree for Better World Day be their choice of planting at the Veterans Memorial Park or Needham Park.

<u>Library ADA Compliance: Vote to approve and authorize the Chair to sign the Professional Services</u> <u>Agreement from Bertin Engineering, Inc. in the amount of \$975.00</u>

Police Cheif Search Committee

Motion 042919-16 by Selectman Matchett; Seconded by Selectman Whalen

The board discusses the possible conflict of nominating Selectman Boyce to serve on the Police Search Committee being that he is still a Selectman set to resign in May, and the Selectmen would be the ones approving the applicants before they are evaluated. Chairman Boyce decides to resign at an earlier time so he could be appointed to this committee. Selectman Matchett nominates Chairman Boyce, Selectman Whalen appoints Howard Whyte. Selectman Matchett lists all members to include himself, Holland Police Chief, Bruce Cadieux, Ed Boyce and Howard Whyte. These said members are what the Police Search Committee will consist of until further appointments are made.

The motion passed unanimously.

<u>Vote to approve amended quote dated April 9, 2019 from Saybrooke Environment and Chemical</u> <u>Management LLC in the amount of \$16,765.42</u>

Selectman Matchett is requesting requesting records to show the increase in expense for the Transfer Station. Selectman Matchett would like to implement a Point of Sale System and draft a job description for employees of the Transfer Station. The board feels that it has become clear that not all residents are being required to purchase yearly stickers, no fees are being imposed for dropping off bulk items along with other services not being compensated for. The board discusses different procedures that need to be implemented in for the for the Transfer Station to run in an efficient and accountable manner. *Selectman Matchett's motion was that the Transfer Station will not accept hazmat waste until July 1st, effectively immediatly.Selectman Whalen also motions to table Transfer Station dicussion until they meet with Mr. Silva on Saturday.*

Selectman Matchett makes a motion to adjourn; Seconded by Selectman Whalen; all in favor, meeting adjourned at 7:10 P.M.
